Little Horkesley Parish Council

meeting held in the Village Hall on Wednesday 17January 2018

Present: Steve Clarke (Chair)

Apologies were received from Cllr. Nigel Chapman (CBC Rural North).

No Pecuniary or Non-pecuniary Interests were declared.

1. Minutes

The minutes of the meeting held on 20 December were approved as an accurate record.

2. Clerk' Report

The Clerk reported the deaths of two stalwarts of the local community, John Burnett, a former term long term Parish Clerk, and Jeremy Cohen, who in the 1970s defeated the plans to expand Nayland Airfield which would have impacted Little Horkesley.

a. Superfast Essex

The Parish Council event being run by Superfast Essex on 22 January in Chelmsford was noted but no Councillor was available to attend.

b. Playing Field

It was reported that the Playground was looking tired and it was agreed to organise a tidy up in early April to weed and generally spruce up the area – the Client to promulgate via the Parish Magazine.

Paul Cutler intends to start on the tree cutting back in the Playing Field next Monday/Tuesday 22/23 February - though that may be delayed by the strong winds of that night.

It appears that no one in CBC has assumed the responsibility for the supply of bark – the Clerk is chasing.

c. Roads/Verges

There was a discussion of what the Highway Rangers could do for Little Horkesley suggested areas:

- Repair of signposts at the Beehive X Roads, A134 and Water Lane and A134 and London Road;
- Cleaning the village sign on Fishponds Hill;
- Painting the kerb at the junction of Water Lane and A134.

d. Data Protection

The "inspection" of the Clerk's retention of information would take place on Thursday 18 January.

e. Affordable Housing

The RCCE questionnaire was reviewed and it was agreed that 8a. should be amended to read ("typically 2-3 homes in a smaller village)"

The notice informing the parish of the survey would go into the February edition of the Parish Magazine.

The anticipated cost would be in the order of £90 to cover return postage.

f. Litter in the Village

The initiative by CBC to litter pick in the Borough 2-4 March was welcomed. It was felt that in Little Horkesley there was not a significant problem, except Vinesse Road. This was due to the efforts of certain members of the community notably Kate Charlton-Jones.

Litter was an ongoing task for the whole community but this year it was felt the playground was the priority.

g. Parish Council Elections

It was noted that the next elections for the Little Horkesley Parish Council will take place in May 2019.

h. Royal Wedding 19 May

The proposal by Chris Jacob for a village party to mark the royal wedding on 19 May was welcomed.

The Chair agreed to organise a B-a-Q and organise necessary supplies.

The Clerk would get the parties together.

3. Planning

a. Motts Workshop

It was noted that CBC would be reviewing developments at the site but only after completion of existing approved works.

b. Thrift Farm

The enforcement order taken out by CBC for the field to the north of the farm to be cleared of unauthorised structures expired in w/c 15 January and, as no action had been taken, CBC would be seeking a court order for the clearance.

4. Finance

a. FY 18/19 Precept

EALC had confirmed that the 6% cap on increases to Council Tax did not apply to Parish Councils. Therefore, a precept of £3,292 had been applied for giving rise to a Village rate of £36.02 +7.0%

b. Quarterly Report

The Quarterly Report to 29 December showing a reserve of £7,437.45 was agreed as being acceptable although some £1,500 of expenses, primarily due to tree trimming work of £1,250, were expected for the remainder of the year.

- c. The expenditure of £50.00 to J R Drury for computer repairs was approved.
- d. Changes in the system for reclaiming VAT were noted.
